APOLLO RENEWAL LEVY ON NOVEMBER BALLOT



The Board of Education of Apollo Career Center has approved the placement of the **renewal** of the .5 mill permanent improvement levy on the November 8, 2005 ballot.

This is not "new money" but a **renewal** of the levy first passed in 1996, and subsequently renewed in 2000. These essential operating funds are used

for acquisition and maintenance of physical facilities, vehicles, instructional equipment, computers, and textbooks, just to name a few.

How does this tax affect the local taxpayer? For a homeowner with a home assessed at \$100,000, the levy would generate \$15.31 a year for the school, or \$7.61 per half year.

Apollo's .5 mill permanent improvement **renewal** levy will be appearing on ballots in Ada, Allen East, Bath, Bluffton, Columbus Grove, Elida, Hardin Northern, Perry, Shawnee, Spencerville, and Wapakoneta.

COLLEGE CREDIT FOR EMT-BASIC AND FIRST RESPONDER COURSES

Apollo Career Center's Public Safety Program (#102) and Rhodes State College's Emergency Medical Services Program (#318) are pleased to announce a unique partnership to better the community.

Beginning this autumn quarter, Rhodes State College will offer the EMT-Basic and First Responder courses for college credit through a cooperative agreement with Apollo Career Center. Indi-

viduals wishing to take either the EMT-Basic course or the First Responder course for college credit may sign up through Rhodes State College and take the courses at Apollo Career Center.

The First Responder course is a 40 hour course designed for firefighters, police officers, and industry workers who may be called in to assist in an emergency situation. The EMT-Basic course is 130 hours in length and students

who successfully complete will be eligible to sit for the National Registry of EMT-Basic exam.

IMPROVEMENTS TO FIRE TRAINING TOWER AND GROUNDS



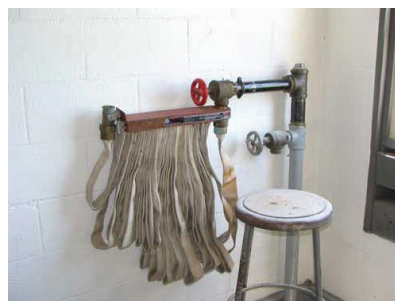
Throughout the summer, Fire Training Coordinator, Ron Zenz, has been busily evaluating and overseeing the repair and update of the Fire Training Tower on campus.

Recently completed improvements to the Fire Training Facility include:

- Installation of a breakthrough wall for Firefighter Safety and Survival course.



- A window was removed on the second story and safety anchors were installed with a wall built, in preparation of the new RIT class.
- The second and third floor room layouts have been changed to appear more realistic for Search & Rescue training and EMS training.
- The drain basin in the front of the Fire Training Tower has been connected to better drainage.
- A new 24' extension ladder has been purchased.
- New First Aid & Blood borne Pathogens Kits installed.
- New marker board installed.
- 2 new hose station examples have been installed.
- Metal installed to protect Fire Training Tower roof during ladder evolutions.
- LP Gas tree has been built for LP Training (to be installed)
- Semi trailer moved in preparation for Ventilation and Confined Space training area.
- Monthly check list for the Tower and Fire Truck implemented.
- Racks installed to hang EMS stretchers
- Purchased new 1.5 inch and 2.5 inch hoses.
- Installation of new heating system (Spring)
- Lettering for installation on surface of Fire Training Tower ordered.
- Fire Training Tower exterior completely repainted.



Future enhancements are planned.

APOLLO'S EMT-BASIC AND FIRST RESPONDER ACCREDITATION RENEWED

On August 5, 2005, Apollo Career Center's EMT-Basic and First Responder Accreditations were reviewed by the Ohio Department of Public Safety. The inspection covered July 1, 2002 to June 30, 2005 records.

Program strengths cited by the State Inspector included:

- Involved Medical Director
- Strong Administrative Support
- Budget to Support the Programs
- Above-Average Facilities
- Adequate Equipment and Supplies
- Experienced Staff in Place.
- Dedicated and Well-Qualified Instructors
- Mentoring and Training System in Place for Instructors.

No citations were issued and the accreditation was renewed for an additional three year period.

PROCEDURES FOR USE OF FIRE TRAINING TOWER BY DEPARTMENTS

Any Department may schedule to use the Apollo Career Center Fire Training Tower by following the following steps:

- STEP 1: Fill out a Tower and Facilities Request Form
- STEP 2: Sign an Agreement Form which stipulates that the Fire Training Tower and facility shall be left/returned to the state in which it is received.
- STEP 3: Apollo Career Center will complete the Application For Use Form.

The fee for using the Fire Training Tower is \$55.00 per hour plus Instructor fees. This fee can reduced by providing your own Instructor.

Public Safety will need to know the type of training that will be held at the Tower, as well as the number of students that will be on site. Additionally, if the department is supplying its own Instructors, Apollo will require a list of their names prior to Tower use.

PUBLIC SAFETY INSTRUCTOR TRAINING COURSE COMPLETED

Seven (7) candidates have completed the seventy (70) hour Public Safety Instructor Training Program.

Trainers, Meri Skilliter and Lois Souder, conducted the training program at Apollo Career Center and Rhodes State College during the Summer quarter.

Four candidates represent the EMT-Intermediate level of Instructor certification; two

candidates represent the EMT-Paramedic level of Instructor certification; while the final candidate represents Fire Instructor certification.

The localities represented by these candidates include Anna, DeGraff, Kenton, Waynesfield, Belle Center, and Wapakoneta.

Certifications are now pending for the candidates. Congratulations are extended to all of these students.

PUBLIC SAFETY INSTRUCTOR TRAINING COURSE SCHEDULED

Have you considered becoming a Public Safety Instructor? Area educational institutions and departments have a continuing need for Public Safety Instructors of all EMT and Firefighter levels. Share your experience, train the next generation of Public Safety personnel.

Applications are now being accepted for an Instructor Training Program scheduled for January 2006.

EMT Instructor candidates must meet the following criteria prior to enrollment:

- Possess a current certificate to practice as a first responder or EMT or a license to practice as a registered nurse;
- Have at least five (5) years of experience as a first responder, EMT or registered nurse in the preceding seven years;
- Pass a written exam that demonstrates a level of knowledge in emergency medical services consistent with the individuals certificate to practice — registered nurse must pass a paramedic level exam;
- Pass a practical exam for their level of certification.

(O.A.C. 4765-18-03)

Fire Instructor candidates must meet the following criteria prior to enrollment:

- Have not less than five (5) years work experience as a firefighter including the three years immediately prior to submission of an application for instructor status;

(O.A.C. 4765-11-08)

Curriculum for both Fire and EMS Instructor Training includes:

- 50 hours in instruction of adult students and basic teaching techniques;
- 8 hours in instruction specific to the field of study (EMS or Fire);
- 10 hours of supervised teaching;
- 2 hours toward completion of the Techniques Exam.

Practicals will be scheduled for all eligible EMS Instructor Applicants.

Please send proof of your Knowledge Exam results and a current resume' and copies of your certification cards to Lois M. Souder, Public Safety Coor-

dinator, at Apollo Career Center with registration.

Knowledge Exams are conducted monthly on campus at Apollo if you meet the pre-entrance requirements listed on the EMS website for O.A.C. 4765-18-03 EMS or O.A.C. 4765-11-08 Fire.

EMS candidates must have a 70% or higher on the written Knowledge Exam and have successfully completed practicals conducted by an accredited institution for your level of certification.

Fire candidates must pass a written exam only to demonstrate an acceptable knowledge level at the Firefighter I and Firefighter II level. A score of 80% or greater is required on the Firefighter Knowledge Exam within 3 attempts to be considered for the Instructor Training Course.
