

## **Truck Driving CDL A**

## **ENROLLMENT CHECKLIST**

	Registration is in person at the Apollo Adult Education Office. The office is open from 8AM-6PM Monday-Thursday and 8AM-3PM Friday (except summer Fridays only open until 11AM). Please bring your driver's license and a \$200 registration fee. You will not have a seat held in a future class until the registration fee is paid.
	<ul> <li>Determine funding source and acquire funding for Tuition balance. Funding must be determined and secured before the physical/drug screen will be scheduled at least two weeks prior to orientation date. Student is responsible for communicating when funding is acquired, Apollo staff will not contact you for updates.</li> <li>This is a short-term program, so federal financial aid is NOT available through FAFSA</li> <li>You may qualify for grant funds through Ohio Means Jobs WIOA grant; you should contact Ohio Means Jobs in your County of residence to inquire about grant funding opportunities once you are officially registered for an upcoming class.</li> <li>If Ohio Means Jobs does not find you eligible for a grant, please contact Joy Baeumel, Financial Aid Specialist at 419-998-2990 or joy.baeumel@apollocc.org to inquire about other funding opportunities available to Truck Driving students.</li> <li>If you are a Veteran, this program is eligible to utilize Veterans Education benefits by providing your Certificate of Eligibility to the Financial Aid Specialist.</li> <li>Final Step to Secure Your Seat! Attend mandatory orientation with approved funding in place, or must pay ½ down payment at orientation, with the final half due prior to testing at end of class. Please bring all required paperwork (a list is provided when registering) to the mandatory</li> </ul>
	orientation date. Failure to attend orientation or bring required paperwork will result in being moved to the next available class (usually 3 to 4 months out).
ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS	
	Students must have valid driver's license, pass a DOT physical examination and school-approved drug screen.
	18 years of age allows students to drive in-state only.
	Minimum age of 21 for interstate driving.
	Students must have no more than four (4) points on his or her current license.
	No DUI/DWI/OMVI motor vehicle substance convictions in the previous five (5) years.
